Argentina

Argentina has a winemaking history stretching back 450 years. With the exception of those of Rio Negro and Neuquén, most of the vineyards lie 600 metres or more above sea level. Main Grape varieties include Malbec, Cabernet Sauvignon, Chardonnay & Torrontés. The grapes are grown on the lower slopes of the Andes.

La Bonita Malbec



Intense violet red colour. Aromas of red fruits with delicate touches of wood. Soft on the palate, balanced with notes of plums and cherries.

La Bonita Malbec Reserva



The Reserva Malbec is full of ripe plum fruits, sweet tannins, dark chocolate and mocha. A full-bodied wine, with juicy tannins and flavour that lingers.



Meet our Producers Las Perdices



In the early 1950s, Juan arrived from Andalucía to farm grapevines. To him work is always more important than recognition and soil marks the rhythm of farm work.

In 2004, his sons decided to build a winery to produce high quality wines with great fascination for innovation. In April that same year, they founded Las Perdices in the heart of their vineyard in Agrelo where they grew up and learned how to make wine.

The winery holds a capacity of 1,200,000 litres in stainless steel tanks of various capacities, in order to optimize processes and better distribute their finest products.

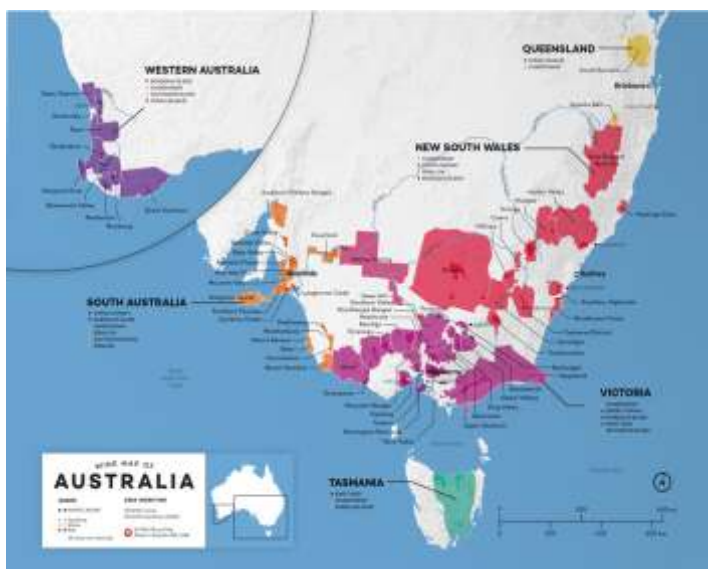

Australia

The first governor of New South Wales recognised the potential for winemaking on his arrival in 1788. From the first plantings, vineyards have now spread to every state in Australia. The transformation in the image of Australian wines has been rapid, it is now recognised in many markets as a significant producer of quality wines. This has been the result of heavy investment, from both within and outside of the country in both the planting of vineyards and construction of wineries with the most modern equipment.

BERTON VINEYARDS

✓ The Home Farm Pinot Grigio

Light, crisp and refreshing with tingly acidity. Flavours of apple, lemon and pear combine to give the palate good length and intensity. Enjoy chilled as an aperitif or with fish and green salads.

✓ The Home Farm Chardonnay

Crisp, fresh wine with generous citrus and passion fruit flavours that linger, creating a satisfying finish.

✓ The Home Farm Shiraz

Balanced, rich palate, full of fruits and ripe tannins.

Head over Heels Chardonnay

An appealing fruit driven wine with aromas of candied citrus fruit, pear drop and ripe melon flavours.

Chile

Chile is South America's most important and largest exporter of wine, with a total of 118 000 hectares planted in Chile with an approximate split of 75% varieties and 25% white.

Chile's unique geographical and climatic conditions offer it many advantages over other wine-producing countries. The country is very long and thin, some 4500 kilometres from the Atacama Desert in the north, to the ice fields of Patagonia to the South, yet it is only on average 150 kilometres wide, with the land sandwiched between the high, snow-capped Andes Mountain range and the cold Pacific Ocean.

Dry crispness on entry followed by a zesty acidity and a citrus fruit aftertaste.

Mouthfilling and smooth, with ripe sweet fruit flavours of plums and currants. The structure is generous, smooth and long.

Garnet of full depth with a raspberry edge. Red fruit flavours, sweet spice and a touch of mint.

✓ Vinoir Sauvignon Blanc

The wine features aromas of gooseberries with hints of peach and lemon. The finish is crispy and fresh with a good balance.

✓ Vinoir Syrah Rose

Delicious strawberry pink. Aromas balanced with refreshingly soft fruit flavours. Perfect alone or with light foods.

This Chardonnay has a bright yellow colour. It has prominent aromas of banana, ripe peach and tropical fruit.

France


France today produces approx. 55 mill hecto litres of wine per year and is still regarded by many around the world as the leader in producing fine wine. More wine is imported into the UK from France than any other country and also accounts for approx. 1/4 of all UK imports. APPELATION d'Origine Controlee (AC or AOC) is the highest level that a French wine can attain. Though the requirements may vary widely from one region to another, they are the most tightly defined. Few countries have such a long standing and developed wine culture as that of France and recognised to be amongst the best in the world.

On the palate it is fresh and light with further cherry flavours and a lovely long finish. 

Fleurie Belle Grace


Soft texture and enticing berry fruit are given a little weight of concentration to make it a serious contender. 

Bourgogne Pinot Noir, Belena

Beautiful ruby colour. The nose offers aromas of undergrowth and red fruits. The mouth is round with vibrant cherry and liquorice notes. Silky tannins. 


White Burgundy

Chablis, Domaine Fillon


Great complexity of fruit character and structure, with typical mineral and flinty notes. Rich and silky with soft creamy mouth feel. 



Macon Blanc Villages, J. Depagneux

Unoaked Chardonnay. Aromas of citrus fruit and minerality on the nose. On the palate dry, fresh and fruity. 

Pouilly-Fuisse, Domaine de Pouilly

This is a rich and tasty wine that ages well. Almond nuances, truffle and other niceties are revealed in the taste. 



Rhône

Chateauneuf-du-Pape, La Bastide St Dominique

Opulent attack in a crunchy style, with full-bodied and elegant tannins. A big freshness in finale with spicy notes. 



Cotes du Rhone, 'Les Violettes'

A ripe fruit style and gathers in prune and juiced tannins. There is depth on the finish, which is dark, marked by dates and smoke that really persists. 



France

✓ Chateau Bel Air, Bordeaux

Deep and bright in colour, with pleasant aromas of ripe red berries. On the palate it is smooth and silky with well-balanced tannins. 🍷



MEDOC

✓ Chateau Moulin de La Hargue

Elegant aromas of red berries and wood with subtle spicy notes. The tannins are present but not dominating, making for a rich and well-balanced wine. 🍷



ST EMILION

Roseville, Pusseguin - St Emilion

On the palate it is silky and smooth with the smallest hint of spice. The finish is long and satisfying. 🍷



VIN DE FRANCE

✓ Pinot Noir, Castelbeaux

A lighter-bodied wine with beautiful fruit forward flavours and aromas such as strawberry and red cherry. 🍷



Guillaume Aurele Viognier, IGP Pays d'Oc

A rare grape variety. Full-flavoured layers of luscious apricot and peachy fruits with a long clean finish.

✓ Picpoul de Pinet 'Le Pied Marin' AOC

Aromas of freshly cut flowers and citrus on the nose. On the palate it is fresh and vibrant with lengthy fruity flavours. 🍷

Loire Valley

Muscadet Sur Lie, Domaine Potardiere

A dry, clean and uncluttered crisp palate. Immensely refreshing. 🍷



Sancerre, Domaine Doucet Paul & Fils

Elegant and refreshing with overtones of gooseberry and citrus flavours on the palate. Intense and aromatic.

ROSE

✓ Moment de Plaisir Cinsault Rose, IGP Pays d'Oc

Pale pink in colour with fruity and intense aromas of citrus and passion fruit on the nose. 🍷

✓ Le Provençal Cotes de Provence Rose

Delicate colour and light wild strawberry nose, then elegant red fruits on the palate. A gentle acidity and great length - perfect for drinking on its own or with light, fresh dishes. 🍷





Germany

Almost uniquely in the world of fine wine, some German white wines are light in body and alcohol and have residual sugar. They are ideal for social occasions or as a refreshing aperitif. They are also good matches with many food styles with many delicious pairings to be explored. Although a much-deserved renaissance has seemed imminent for some years, the medium-sweet wines such as Liebfraumilch remain unfashionable. With climate changes Germany is becoming increasingly warmer, meaning that a greater percentage of wines each year are being produced in a dry style that is more popular with consumers.

✓ Niersteiner Gutes Domtal Schmitt Sohne, Qba

Niersteiner Gutes Domtal Qba is a medium-bodied, fragrant wine with upfront fruit, a touch of spice and a mild soft finish.

Riesling Classic, Dr Dahlem

A wonderfully clean expression of the Riesling grape. This modern designation allows for fully ripe flavours to come to the fore.

Italy

Italy, with an annual production of nearly 5 billion litres, is together with France, one of the two giants of global wine production. Greek settlers introduced the vine to Italy as early as 800 BC and took to Italy's rugged countenance with zeal. The Greeks christened Italy 'Oenotria' or 'land of the vine' and by the time the Western Roman Empire collapsed in AD 476 every modern European region of production, except Bordeaux, has been established. Wine fuelled the excesses of generations of Roman emperors and Pliny, writing in the first century AD, introduced notions of the site selection and vine husbandry that remain relevant more than 2000 years later.

✓ Cadia Garganega Pinot Grigio, DOC Garda 🍷

A dry, easy drinking wine with light, fruit flavours and a crisp, attractive finish.



✓ Cadia, Pinot Grigio Blush, DOC Veneto 🍷

The wine is a pale, blush colour with a bouquet of fruited elegance. The taste is delicate, fruited and persistent.



Valpolicella Ripasso, Superiore Villalta DOC 🍷

Oak aging adds a subtle roasted, spicy aroma. On the palate it is full-bodied, supple and well-balanced with a long finish. 🍷



Gavi, Antario DOCG Piedmont 🍷

Intense bouquet, fresh fruity palate, with a complex finish, reminiscent of almonds. 🍷

✓ Torre dei Vescovi Pinot Grigio, DOC Vicenza 🍷

Golden yellow in colour the bouquet is delicate with complex floral notes. The wine is dry, pleasantly fresh and velvety. 🍷

✓ Torre dei Vescovi, Soave, DOC Vicenza 🍷

Straw yellow colour. Delicate with notes of white flowers. Pleasant bitter taste with a medium body and proper acidity. 🍷




Italy

CENTRAL WEST REGION


Emilia Romagna, Tuscany, Lazio

✓ Chianti, Terre di Faiano, DOCG Tuscany

The wine has a lovely ruby red colour with a bouquet reminiscent of cherries, wild berries and prunes. On the palate it is medium-bodied, soft and smooth and bursting with deliciously gentle tannins. 



Chianti Classico, Poggio Morino DOCG, Tuscany

Matured in large oak barrels for 15 months and then bottle-aging for a min. of 3 months. Intense and brilliant red colour, fine nose, it has a elegant and harmonious palate, with a strong body and great balance. 



CENTRAL EAST REGION

Umbria, Marche, Abruzzo

✓ Alpino Montepulciano d'Abruzzo, DOC

A smooth red wine. It is made with solely Montepulciano grapes. The colour is dark red, the palate brings intense impressions of cherries and soft spices. This results in a medium-bodied wine, which holds lovely soft tannins.



Meet our Producers Masseria Borgo Dei TRULLI




The estate is in the central part of the Salento region, close to the Salice Salentino DOP region and the site where many Trulli were once sited.

The grapes are carefully picked by hand and are placed in small wooden crates of 5kg each. The crates are then placed in the 'fruttaio', a well aerated loft and are left to dry in a controlled area for around 10 days. The grapes will, depending on the vintage, loose upto 40% of their weight in water, therefore concentrating their colour, substance and aromas.

Trulli are the traditional houses of the farm workers, dating back to the Middle Ages.

✓ Trulli Primitivo Salento, IGP

Intense ruby-red in colour, with aromas of black cherries, prunes, spice and white pepper. Full-bodied, velvety and elegant, with soft yet firm tannins. Long, lingering finish. 





New Zealand

It is often difficult to comprehend how small a player New Zealand is in the world of wine. If you consider the area it has under vines it just manages to make the top 50 countries of the world and in terms of production it has only just made the top 30. Non-New Zealanders control more than 85% of this and half the total production is in the hands of one international company. Because the domestic market for New Zealand is so small the wine industry has to rely on exporting, of which Britain is by far the most important export market.

Marlborough



South Island Sauvignon Blanc



This award-winning wine has elderflower and gooseberry fruit on the nose with an edge of ripe pear. Racy on the palate with a core of orchard fruits that is very pure and focused. Finish is soft and warm.



Penny Lane Sauvignon Blanc



Aromas of pineapple, gooseberries and guava dominate. The weighty palate presents passion fruit and gooseberry with a zesty lime backbone and a lengthy finish.

Penny Lane Pinot Noir Reserve



The grapes are selected from the inland, elevated Matapiri region and matured in French Oak Barriques. This vintage shows very good depth of vibrant plum and spice flavours, fresh and smooth.



Meet our Producers One Tree Hill Winery



The Wine Portfolio is a collection of distinctive New Zealand wine brands. The journey of The Wine Portfolio started in 1995 when John M Coney purchased the Morton Estate after he tasted the 1994 Black Label Pinot Noir from the Riverview vineyard. That Pinot was a sign for John of the potential in the company. His vision for the winery was for consistency to become a hallmark of the enterprise. Under the umbrella of "The Wine Portfolio" the new team set about to developing vineyards, investing in winemaking facilities and building a set of new brands around Morton Estate. In 1996 a new crush plant was built at Riverview and the headquarters of the business was moved into a beautifully renovated historic building in Auckland.

The Wine Portfolio team as an innovating bunch, so it's worth to keep in touch as there's always more coming down the pipeline.



South Africa

South African wine has a history dating back to 1659 with Constantia, a vineyard near Cape Town, being considered one of the greatest wines in the world. Access to international markets has unleashed a burst of new energy and new investment. Production is concentrated around Cape Town, with major vineyards and production centres at Paarl, Stellenbosch and Worcester. Today South Africa exports around 450 million litres of wine, with over 100,000 hectares of vineyard. The country is committed to sustainable wine farming and is the 9th largest producer of wine in the world. Chenin Blanc is the most widely planted variety in South Africa.

Crisp, dry and subtle with medium body. The palate follows through with fruit flavours, balanced by crisp acidity to ensure a fresh and fruity style of wine.

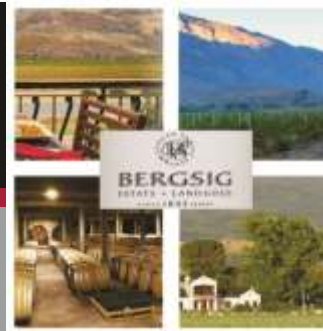

Meet our Producers Bergsig Estate

Bergsig Estate is situated in the Breedkloof area of Breede River Valley in South Africa, about 110 km from Cape Town.

The Lategan Family's roots in the South African winelands began in 1735 when Johann Hermann Lategan settled in the Wamakers Valley near the current Bergsig Estate. In 1843 William Hendrik Lategan moved to Bergsig. Seven generations later, the proud tradition continues. Bergsig has been in the family for more than 170 years. Being an Estate, all the wines are "grown, made and bottled" on the property.





Spain

Spain's vineyards produced 51 million hectolitres of wine last years, beating competitors France and Italy which produced 42m and 47m respectively, placing it number one in the world. More than half of last year's harvest came from the region of Castilla-La Mancha, with the bumper harvest which led to Spain becoming the world's biggest wine producer in 2013 put down to a wet spring and sunny summer.

Meet our Producers Eguren Ugarte

Eguren Ugarte is a family winery founded in 1870 by Mr. Vitorino Eguren Ugarte, currently ran by the sixth generation of men and women dedicated to the fascinating world of growing vines and winemaking.

Thanks to this, they have managed to preserve many of the traditional winemaking techniques and practices, as well as incorporating some of the latest technologies and techniques to enhance the winemaking processes. All this results in exceptional wines that win major national and international awards.



Rioja

BLANCO

✓ Eguren Ugarte Blanco

Attractive pale yellow colour. Delicate floral and citrus nose. Flavourful, balanced acidity and pleasantly easy to drink.



TINTO

Tondeluna Rioja Tinto

Aromas of fruit on the nose and liquorice hints. On the palate it is full-bodied with deep structure. Long, persistent finish.

Bodegas Santiago Reserva

Aged for over 36 months, 12 months of which is spent in American oak. Intense ruby red in colour, with deep complex aromas. On the palate it is well-rounded and velvety, full-bodied and balanced. Precise and delicious.



Castilla

Viña Peña Tempranillo

Intense bright ruby colour. Aromas are very fruity with ripe cherry and blackcurrant which are combined with hints of ripe red berries. Pleasant fruity palate.

Viña Peña Airen

Very pale golden hue. Aromas of fruit, pear, melon, pineapple and ripe citrus. White flowers give elegance. A refreshing and easy drinking white wine.

Viña Peña Tempranillo Rosé

Bright medium pink. Ripe red berries on the nose and violet candies. Balanced on the palate, light fresh and easy drinking.



USA

The history of American wine began when the first Europeans explored parts of North America. In California, where 'Adriana' is grown the first vineyards were established in the 18th century by the Spanish. California now accounts for nearly 90 percent of American wine production.

Adriana Zinfandel Rose

A fruity rose with flavours of strawberries and a delicate sweetness. Versatile to enjoy on its own, with spicy dishes or fruit deserts.



Sparkling

No wine region in the world apart from Champagne is solely dedicated to the production of sparkling wine, they are nonetheless made in nearly every wine region in the world.

Some producers look to copy the style of Champagne whereas others make wines of a very different style, often using local grape varieties and different production methods.

In the last few years the consumption of sparkling wines has seen considerable growth, a trend that is set to continue.

Italy

COLLI VICENTINI

✓ Prosecco Frizzante (SCRENCAP)

Delightful gentle bubbles with an inviting nose of citrus fruits. A pleasant mouth feel.



✓ Romeo Prosecco Spumante

Fine with a persistent mousse with a rich aroma of ripe apple, lemon and grapefruit. On the palate it is fresh and full-bodied.

✓ Juliet Rose Spumante

Intense and fruity aroma of blossom and ripe passion fruit. Pleasant acidity on the palate, fresh and full-bodied.



Spain

Castell Llord Cava Brut

Exceptionally fruity with very delicate and lovely soft toasty aromas with a dry lingering citrus flavour.



Champagne

The most northern vineyard area of France, the Champagne region lies North-East of Paris, its heart in the form of a double fish-hook, with the valley of the River Marne as its shank. The three main vineyards concentrations are the Ballee de la Marne, The Montagne de Reims and the Cote des Blancs.

Champagne is a sparkling wine produced from grapes grown in the Champagne region of France following rules that demand secondary fermentation of the wine in the bottle to create carbonation.

Some use the term Champagne as a generic term for sparkling wine, but the majority of countries reserve the term exclusively for sparkling wines that come from Champagne and are produced under the rules of the appellation. Champagne appellation law only allows grapes grown according to appellation rules in specifically designated plots within the appellation to be used in the production of Champagne

Champagne Boizel

✓ Boizel Brut Reserve

True ambassador of the House, the Brut Reserve expresses the elegance and the finesse typical of the Boizel style. Its freshness and generous aromas make it ideal Champagne for apertif.



✓ Boizel Rosé

A delicate cuvee revealing the finesse of the Pinots from Champagne. Its pale pink robe and its subtle aromas of red fruits are obtained through blending with 8% Pinot Noir vinified in red wine.



CLAUDE BARON

Claude Baron Saphir Brut

This Cuvee with a highest majority of Pinot Meunier is fruity and delicate.
